2019 marks 20 years since Open the Book first started. To mark the occasion, some of our pupils were invited to dress up and join representatives from St. Mary's Church and other Open the Book teams from across the Guildford Diocese to celebrate with a short service and afternoon tea.

Open the Book is a project which offers primary school children an opportunity to hear Bible stories, from a team of Christians from local churches. At Horsell Junior School, a team from St. Mary's Church bring the bible stories to life once a week during assembly, through drama, story telling and discussion.
