Composer of the Month—Clara Schumann

Clara Schumann was a German pianist, composer and piano teacher. Her father was a professional piano teacher and her mother was an accomplished singer. Clara was regarded as one of the most distinguished pianists of the Romantic Era, she exerted her influence over a 61-year concert career, changing the format and repertoire of the piano recital from displays of virtuosity to

programmes of serious works. Her most recognised composition is Piano Concerto in A minor, Op. 7.

Chertsey Museum visit Anglo Saxons

On Tuesday this week, Year 5 had a fun and educational visit from Chertsey Museum, who came to talk to them about the Anglo Saxons.

The children got to handle a variety of both real and replica Anglo Saxon artefacts—including a double ended spear which was over 1,000 years old.
