Thank you from your PTA

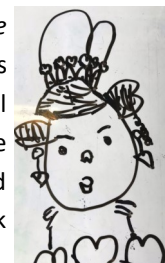
The PTA would like to thank everyone who volunteered or came to purchase uniform at our Good As New Sale. Over £800 was raised.

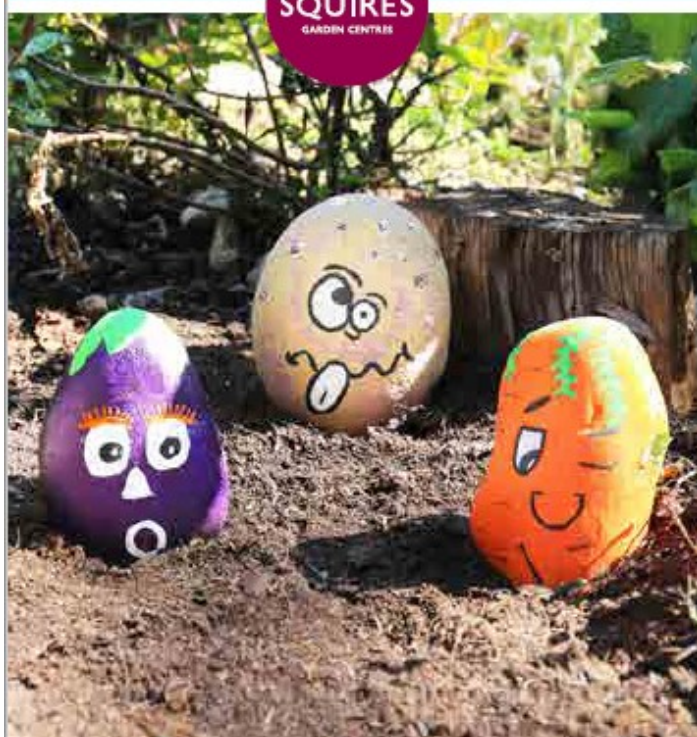

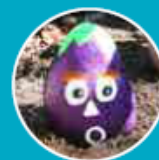
