## **Snap shot reports**

Children will be coming home with their first 'snap shot' reports today. We have recently done assessment tests in school, and these reports show the result the children attained in Reading and Maths. We use a standardised score to measure attainment, and a mark of 100 shows a child is working at the current year standards. Obviously, because of the schooling that children missed last year, some children will not have achieved this standard yet. Parents should not be unduly concerned about this at this early stage in the academic year. The report also show a 'hodder score.' This is how we measure progress from term to term, and will mean more at the next report when we can track the progress the children are making. Parents will have the opportunity to ask teachers about these assessments at your parent consultation meetings next week.

#### Stationery in School

As we begin a new half term under new guidance and regulations, we would just like to remind you of the school stationery requirements. Unfortunately, due to the restrictions children cannot share their equipment. Not having the correct stationery can reduce the pace and efficiency of the lesson, for example when support needs to be given to glue in activities into the children's books. Therefore, please ensure children have the correct stationery with them in school each day.

Please can we remind you that each child needs to have with them the following, which should remains in school at all times until it has run out and needs to be replaced:

- Glue stick
- HB pencils x2
- Sharpener
- Rubber
- Ruler
- Blue pen x2
- Purple pen for editing and polishing work
- Colour pencils (ideally in a separate pencil case so this doesn't clutter up the table)

If under the current restrictions you are finding it difficult to supply your child/ren with the stationery please notify us and we can support you with this where we can.
