



Dear Parents and Carers

I'm finding it hard to believe that we are breaking up for Christmas already! Although school has been 'different', we have still managed to pack lots of fun learning experiences into the term. Some particular highlights have been:

1. The Year 3 Nativity – different, but still fantastic! I hope Year 3 parents enjoyed the show!

2. Remote Collective Worship. Although we haven't been in the hall, staff and children have continued to worship together. New Assembly Ambassadors are ensuring that children have more of a role in this aspect of school life. Volunteers from 'Open the Book' have continued to bring bible stories to life and it has been wonderful to keep our link with St Mary's going, even though we can't meet in person.

3. Our resourceful PTA. Even covid can't stop our fantastic volunteers from thinking of innovative ways to raise money! PTA funds are currently being spent on some new playground markings, playground games, and school books and dictionaries.

4. New ways of music making. Many of our visiting instrumental tutors have staged virtual concerts and the school is frequently filled with the sounds of violins, trumpets, drums and much more!

5. Our new maths curriculum. Years 3 – 5 are using a new maths scheme called 'Maths No Problem'. Teachers have had to work hard to implement the new approach, and children are now more and more confident to discuss maths and think of different ways to solve mathematical problems.

6. Support for children's learning after the national lockdown. It has been lovely to walk through the school after 3:20pm and see teachers working with small groups of children to give them even more support with their learning. Our online tutoring programme, 'Third Space Learning', is also proving very successful, and selected children from Year 4 will be starting to learn with another tutoring programme, 'Lightning Squad', in January.

7. Our new nurture room! Although we cannot use it as much as we would like because of COVID restrictions, the room is providing a safe space for our ELSA support and school counsellor.

8. Welcoming Ms Ash to Horsell Junior. Ms Ash is responsible for Inclusion, Safeguarding and SEND and the impact that she is having on the emotional wellbeing of our children is already being felt throughout the school.

9. Our wonderful Christmas angel – made by children in the lower school and now on display at Guildford Cathedral.

10. Our early morning sports clubs. Although some parents might not appreciate the earlier starts (!), children have really enjoyed their morning sports with Mr Coles and they return to class happy, eager, and ready to learn.

The term has also not been without its challenges, and we were all extremely disappointed to have to close the Year 5 bubble before the end of term. As a working parent myself, I am more than aware of the impact of bubble closures. As you know, closures are implemented on the advice of Public Health England and we follow their advice when there is a confirmed case in school. We will continue to do all we can to keep school safe and I would urge all parents to exercise caution over the holiday period so we can all return to school in January.

I hope that you all have a wonderful Christmas with your families. For those of you who may be feeling some sadness about changing plans during this time of national uncertainty, I leave you with a quote from one of the Psalms:

COVID – IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR THE HOLIDAYS

Please be aware that although the school closes for Christmas on 18th December, we still carry responsibility for contact tracing of pupils who test positive.

If a pupil or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school we have to assist in identifying close contacts and advising upon self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus having developed symptoms more than 48 hours after being in school, they must follow contact tracing instructions if they are required to do so.

School Uniform

Please make sure that your child comes to school in the correct school uniform. Children should wear black school shoes, not trainers, and girls' skirts should be knee length. In order to keep classrooms safe, windows are kept open throughout the day so please make sure your child has a warm coat. They should also have a waterproof cagoule for PE lessons, which can be kept in their PE bags. We would also recommend that girls wear tights during the colder months.
