I am sure that you, like me, were delighted to hear that schools will be fully reopening on 8th March. We have really missed having all of the children in school and I simply cannot wait to

welcome everyone back soon! I have been incredibly thankful for the amazing dedication shown by all members of our school community – parents, staff, governors, children – at keeping the learning going over these past months. - Rubber
- Ruler
- Blue pen x2
- Purple pen for editing and polishing work
- 2 whiteboard markers
- Colour pencils (ideally in a separate pencil case so this doesn't clutter up
