

The day started off with a thought-provoking and entertaining video about the Easter story created by the Engage Team.

This year our theme was 'journeys'. Year 3 and 4 were looking at clues to Jesus being amazing, extra-ordinary or miraculous whilst looking at what he did throughout his life. Years 5 and 6 were considering the viewpoints of the different eyewitnesses and the emotions that they felt as the events from Palm Sunday to the resurrection unfolded - despair, jubilation, disappointment, fear, confusion, guilt and astonishment.

The whole day was spent considering these questions in depth and included interactive prayer activities. Years 4,5 and 6 shared their findings and prayer gardens over a whole school 'zoom' assembly led by Mrs Collier at the end of the day.
