The Purple Princess

On Thursday 27th May the children in years 3, 4 and 5 were treated to a Covid-safe performance of 'The Purple Princess', a play about the hidden disability of epilepsy. After almost a month of solid rain, the sun shone down on Horsell and the performers were able to use the outside stage for their performance. The story showed the children a princess who had seizures and they learned what they might see if someone they knew had a seizure. They also learned the "Calm, Cushion, Call" rule and asked some extremely mature questions about epilepsy and how it might affect others. Bikeability

Last week, many of our Year 6 pupils undertook Bikeability Level



2. Bikeability is a nationwide course run to a national standard, which aims to develop the children's skills and confidence for cycling on single-lane roads with simple junctions and moderate traffic. After a classroom briefing, they went out each day (in hail, rain and strong winds) putting their learning into practice. They learnt to negotiate junctions, about the priorities of the road and how to communicate their intentions to other road users. We hope this training will help our pupils make independent decisions and cycle safely in the future.

- to build young people's confidence, character and resilience through arts and cultural education
- to use Artsmark's clear and flexible framework to embed creativity across the whole curriculum and use it to address school improvement priorities.
- to celebrate our long-term commitment to cultural education with pupils, parents and our local community.

We have 2 years to complete our Artsmark journey and once we have completed it we will be assessed again by the Arts Council. A few of our main aims are; To establish an Arts Council to encourage pupil voice, to become an Arts Ambassador school working with other local schools, to expand music provision (create a school choir and orchestra), to see live theatre and music events, to visit art galleries and develop links with our wider community.
