

PE and Sports Premium for Horsell C of E (A) Junior School
Financial Year 2017-2018 Impact statement

In this financial year (2017/8), we have received £15,487 of Sports Premium Funding. We have used it to improve the PE provision in the school.

The following is an outline of how the money has been spent and its impact on PE provision within the school.

School Sports Coach – Clubs and Fixtures - £3000

Mr. Coles, our Sports Coach continues to offer free sports clubs for a range of sports. This enables him to work more closely with able pupils identified during curriculum time. By running our sports teams he is able to ensure consistency for pupils as they move into a competitive arena. He is also able to coach teams and take them to fixtures and festivals. This has enabled the performance of our pupils to be maximized whilst ensuring that the behavior of our pupils as ambassadors for the school is maintained off site. His efforts during after school clubs have enabled the pupils to excel in several sports including football, tag rugby, netball and cross country. The school has won many borough wide competitions in these sporting fields.

Investment in new scheme for Dance and CPD for Staff - £840

We have introduced the iMoves scheme of work for Dance and Gym. This has streamlined the planning for these disciplines. It has also enabled us to ensure better consistency and progression across year groups. To maximize the impact of the new scheme, we paid for external coaching on how to deliver effective lessons using iMoves. This was delivered to 12 staff members in the September INSET day.

Subsidizing Swimming lessons - £600

By subsidizing swimming lessons we are able to offer a comprehensive program of swimming that benefits all our children regardless of ability or financial position. As a result of this we can maximize the benefits of having a covered swimming pool on site.

Dance Woking Festivals - £100

We have used Sports Premium money to give 22 of our pupils the opportunity to receive professional choreography and a chance to perform on stage at a theatre in Woking. This has raised the profile of dance in our school and within the wider community. One of these events was for a boy's only club that benefitted some of least active and SEN children in the school.

PE Games Resources - £625

We have invested money into improving the quality of our equipment for several sports including tag rugby, cricket and netball. These new resources are being carefully looked after and maintained by our sports coach and should be in good condition used for several years to come. By having more of these resources we have dramatically improved the provision of our PE Games sessions and after school clubs.

New Games resources - £1071

We have invested again in provisions for our outdoor PE lessons. This has included rugby balls, new markers, multiple small goals, bibs, kits, nets and net ties. This has helped ensure that there are enough resources to engage all pupils in all lessons.

Outdoor Learning - £150

To complement our Outdoor Learning planning we invested in new equipment to make the Outdoor Learning sessions more effective. This included ropes and guttering for several challenges that are contained in the scheme of work.

Sports Memberships – £280

We continue to contribute membership to WASPS (our local Woking Primary Sports Federation). This gives us ongoing access to several inter-school competitions throughout the year. We are also members of the Youth Sport Trust.

Special Events - £1,040

In the last year we have been fortunate enough to offer experiences to our children above what is possible in normal curriculum time by using our funding effectively. These have included training a Y5 Sports Crew who now deliver sessions to pupils in school. Creating our 'Run to Mwanhala' program enabled all children to be more active by walking and running more. We also worked closely with several community clubs including Hoebridge Golf Club, Chobham RFC and Cardinals Netball. All this created a rich curriculum and enhanced the PE provision for all pupils.

iMoves Daily Challenges - £150

We upgraded our iMoves account to include daily challenges. These are online active sessions to be used in classrooms as brain breaks between sessions. This was introduced to teachers in a staff meeting. It sits alongside our new Mindfulness initiative in school.

Surrey PES Membership £650

We are now PES members with Active Surrey. This membership gives us access to Surrey conferences, best practice forums and further CPD. Working with Active Surrey via this scheme has improved the confidence and skill of our teachers and has enabled our PE lead to investigate improving PE within the school by sharing ideas and looking into new schemes of work etc. Directly via the membership we hope to start a new dance scheme of work in the new academic year which should improve the skill and confidence of all teachers.

Class cover - £102.5

We used some of the premium funding to enable our PE lead to attend training for a new PE monitoring tool.

PE Health Wheel - £190

We have invested in the Real PE Health Wheel. This is an online tool that enables the school to track its progress in all areas of the PE curriculum. This will enable the PE lead to monitor the subject more effectively and communicate to internal and third parties what is being targeted for future improvement.

Outdoor Gymnasium - £10,000

A large proportion of the funding has been set aside to build a new outside gymnasium for the school. We have had multiple quotes and hope to build the gym in the coming months. This will then be used in PE lessons and in break times to increase the physical activity of every pupil of the school. Young leaders in the school will be given responsibility to ensure that the equipment is used to its maximum capability.

This total currently comes to £18,696
