Composer of the Month - Saint-Saëns

Saint-Saëns was a French composer from the Romantic Era. He was also an organist, conductor and pianist. His best-known works include Introduction and Rondo Capriccioso, the Second Piano Concerto, the First Cello Concerto, Danse Macabre, the opera Samson and Delilah, the Third



Violin Concerto, the Third Symphony and The Carnival of the Animals. His piece the 'Organ Symphony' was commissioned by the Royal Philharmonic Society in the UK, and Saint- Saëns travelled across the Channel to conduct its premiere at the old St. James's Hall, now the site of Le Meridien Hotel in Picadilly.

Year 6 Family Learning

On Wednesday afternoon an interactive Family learning spelling session took place in year 6. Children demonstrated and shared a variety of spelling games with visiting parents and grandparents; they particularly enjoyed testing the adults' spelling skills.

Year 5 Sciences Experiments

Year 5 have had an exciting week of scientific studies.

On Monday, the Year 5 classes visited Woking High School to undertake experiments, looking for reactive changes. They put a nail into some copper sulphate, they dropped a piece of magnesium into hydrochloric acid and used a flame to create a squeaky pop test for hydrogen.

On Thursday, Year 5 classes enjoyed a scientific day at school. Classes rotated across the year group. Exploding foam elephant toothpaste, gas filled balloons and dissolving salts were some of the highlights of the day.
