Composer of the Month

Each month, at our school, we learn about a different classical composer. We listen and appreciate their music. We will work chronologically through the genres of classical music, starting with the Renaissance period.



Guillaume Dufay

Guillaume Dufay was a leading composer in the mid-15th century Europe at the beginning of the Renaissance period. During this time, chanting dominated the Medieval era when Catholic monks began to standardize sacred music

throughout the church. Instruments from this period include early versions of the flute and the violin. The invention of printed music and a variety of instruments facilitated rapid growth in classical music and the Renaissance period turned out several notable composers.

Throughout lockdown children were able to continue with their learning remotely. We used Seesaw to enable teachers to set activities that the children completed at home.

As we move in to a new phase of learning, we will continue to make use of Seesaw for distance learning. If a child has to self-isolate because of a suspected Covid-19 case in the family, then they will be able to carry on with their school work through Seesaw. Each year group will upload the English and Maths learning for the week on to Seesaw. This will ensure that when the child returns to school, they will not have missed out on their learning. These activities will be clearly identified on Seesaw as COVID work and only need to be completed if your child is self-isolating.

We will also use Seesaw to set one piece of English homework a week. This activity will be clearly identified as homework and the expectation is that this is completed by everyone.

Multi Sports Clubs

This week our Multi Sports clubs started before school. Children taking part have had the opportunity to develop their sporting skills and experience new sports.

Last week we showed most of our children the website READTHEORY ReadTheory as a way to complete reading homework online. The children have been engaging with this well

and are enjoying using it to help develop their reading skills.

ReadTheory is a free site for us to use, but in order for it to remain free, ReadTheory sustain their site through a combination of advertising and the sale of print materials from ReadTheoryworkbooks.com. ReadTheory have stated that all of the ads that appear on their site are child-friendly or all-age appropriate. If ever you see anything on the site that you deem questionable, please immediately reach out to them and let the office know by email. Screenshots as well as the exact URL of the link are the best ways to ensure they can track down the ad and remove it as quickly as possible. They have a dedicated staff member in charge of the ad experience at ReadTheory, so it is a very rare event that even mildly questionable ads ever appear on their site. Please let them know right away if you or your children see anything you think is concerning. As a parent please check your firewall and cookie settings to ensure the children can safely access ReadTheory and continue their learning.
