

HELP PROTECT GROUND NESTING BIRDS

Horsell Common is a Site of Special Scientific Interest and also a Special Protected Area. It is a great place to walk and has been a lifeline to us during Lockdowns. The fact that Horsell Common borders and serves an urban region and has had such an increased footfall has put some of the sensitive areas at risk. The most sensitive areas are where there is heather, either long established, brown and dismal at present but gorgeous in summer or regenerated and still very short in the areas called "Grasslands" and opposite The Sands. It lies between Littlewick Road, Carthouse Lane and Horsell Common Road. This open, bright area with young heather is the perfect habitat for several insects, birds and reptiles which need "specialist" habitats have returned. The Woodlark has returned after a long absence. It is a rare ground nesting bird and is now on the short heather of Grasslands. As well as families that walk all across the heather, horses which go through their trotting paces and dogs, the paths have become very wide with all the recent usage. We can all help by simply staying on the paths. In this way, people, dogs and horses would not frighten the birds

away or damage the nests and eggs and nestlings. The same applies to the **Nightjar and the Dartford warbler**, which tend to be in the areas where the heather is big and bushy, but equally at risk.

Fortnite

An update

Is your child playing Fortnite? It appears to remain popular, so we thought we'd provide an update for you. It is rated PEGI 12 for frequent mild violence which means it is not suitable for persons under 12 years of age.

It is important to remember that when rating games, PEGI do not take into consideration the communication features of a game. Fortnite does include a chat facility, which adds further risks.

What is Fortnite?

There are different versions of Fortnite, including a free-to-play Battle Royale game (although money can be spent within the game) where up to 100 players compete against each other.

What do I need to be aware of?

Chatting to strangers and inappropriate language:

Fortnite contains voice and text chat. Due to the nature of the game, your child may be chatting to strangers and may hear inappropriate language. Ensure your child knows how to report players for any inappropriate behaviour. In app purchases:

All users can purchase V-Bucks directly through the game. This currency can be used to purchase items in the Fortnite store so make sure you don't store your payment details within the game/device and restrict purchases. More information about what in-game purchases are can be found here:

Addictive nature:

Games such as Fortnite can be addictive. It is important that children play games in moderation and that they continue to exercise and have other interests as well.



Parental Controls

Fortnite includes several parental controls to help you make it a safer environment for your child including disabling voice chat, filtering language and setting privacy settings. Find out more about parental controls here: https://www.epicgames.com/fortnite/en-US/parental-controls. Also, remember to set up age appropriate parental controls on the device your child is playing on as well.

We always recommend playing the game with your child so you can see what they are playing and monitor the sort of chat that they are listening to/contributing to. Remind your child that they should talk to you or another trusted adult if they have any concerns.
