Who do I contact?

If you have a question about the school, always check the website or the most recent newsletter. Most information can be found there. Information about specific year groups is also in the Year group section of the website.

If you have a specific question about your child, you should email the class teacher – remembering, of course, that they are teaching between 8 30am and 3 10pm! We aim to respond to emails with 2 working days. If you are still concerned, you should contact the Head of Year, followed by the Deputy Head (for academic concerns) or Ms Ash (for pastoral concerns).

Home learning and COVID

Please note, class learning is only sent home to children who are off school due to COVID. Work is not sent home for children who are absent with any other illness. This work is set via Seesaw. The children in Year 3 are currently learning how to use this system in their computing lessons at school, so there may be a slight delay in setting work via Seesaw for the first few weeks of term.

Merits and House Points

We have reviewed how we reward our children at Horsell Junior. House points are given out for excellent behaviour and attitudes, and demonstrating the Horsell ethos. Merits are given to children for the work that they do in the classroom. We will no longer be awarding 'bronze', 'silver' and 'gold' merits. Instead, we will celebrate the merits every week in assembly and we will celebrate the house with the most house points every half term. We are proud of our children and we believe this is a positive way of recognising the excellent work that they do.

Earrings—safety reminder

Please could we remind parents that children who have pierced ears should remove their earrings before school where possible. Children who cannot remove their earrings for school should have their earrings covered by a plaster before arriving at school, to be worn at all times during the school day.

Parents were sent a letter yesterday asking for loose parts. Collection mornings are from Wednesday – Friday next week. As a reminder, we are looking

for 'loose parts', which include items such as:

- Suitcases of any size and type
- Anything on wheels/castors
- Plastic milk crates
- Briefcases, especially hard cased ones
- Road signs and cones
- kitchen pots, pans, baking trays, worktables, wooden spoons, chopping boards
- Tools like spades, trowels and brooms
- tubes of various sizes and various materials
- Buckets
- Nets and ropes
- Keyboards
- Fabric (large sheets/brightly coloured fabric)
- Foam sheets / body boards
- Cable drums
- Guttering
- Noodles (the type you use in the swimming pool!)
- Pegs (to help to set up dens)

Please notify us of any dietary requirements and changes even if your child has packed lunches, as we will use this information also for food-related activities in school, including cookery and forest school.


Medicines in School
