ADDITIONAL HOLIDAY—22ND OCTOBER 2021

An additional school holiday has been scheduled by the council on Friday 22nd October 2021. This is in lieu of the additional Platinum Jubilee Bank Holiday which takes place on 3rd June 2022, which falls in the summer half term break.

ARRIVING AT SCHOOL

Please note that our gates close promptly at 8:40am. After this time registration is via the office. This earlier time was agreed by our governors following a formal consultation with parents in 2020.

REMOTE LEARNING OFFER

Now that school is operating 'normally' we have reviewed our remote learning offer for pupils who are absent from school because they have COVID. Please take the time to read the following information:

- Teachers will provide remote learning, via Seesaw, for any child who is absent from school because they have contracted COVID.
- 2. If a child is unwell with COVID symptoms they are not expected to complete remote learning.
- Maths, Reading and Writing classwork will be loaded onto SEESAW for the first FULL day of absence due to COVID. If a parent informs the school at the start of the school day the work will be posted on to SEESAW by 5 00pm at the latest.
- One foundation subject will be posted per full day of absence.
 This may be school work or learning produced by an online provider, such as the Oak Academy.
- Children's written work should be completed on lined paper, photographed and uploaded onto SEESAW.
- Knowledge organisers for each subject are posted on each Year
 Group area of the website to enable parents to further support their child's learning.
- Every day, teachers will check these children's online submissions to SEESAW and leave a comment for Maths, English and reading work.
- 8. All teachers have a list of those children who do not have computer access. Parents of these children should be contacted so that a Chromebook can be organised. Alternatively, the teacher will collate work for posting, first class, the following day.
- 9. A member of the Office Team will contact, via email, the parents of all children absent from school on the first day of absence. The teacher will contact on the second day and twice weekly thereafter. Children not completing home learning will be referred to the Deputy Head or Assistant Head for a follow up call.

This procedure will not be followed for normal childhood illnesses, such as coughs and colds.

Teachers will not provide work for children awaiting test results as these are usually returned within 24 hours. Children absent from school for more than 24 hours whilst waiting for results should inform the school office.

Coats

The weather is now very changeable and we like to send our children out to play in all weathers.



Please ensure that your child brings a named coat to school every day. If possible, they should also have a cagoule (lightweight waterproof coat) in their PE bag so that they can participate in outdoor sports come rain or shine.

Applications for secondary school places are now open to year 6 students.

The closing date is 31st October 2021.


