#### **Homework & Seesaw**

#### **Autumn assessments**

In November, our whole school will be taking part in assessments for reading, SPAG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and maths using NTS formal assessments. Teachers will also be assessing writing using the independent writing activities the children have already completed over the previous half term. As a school we use this information, along with in class teacher judgements, to map out our future planning, intervention groups and highlight any gaps in knowledge which may need to be taught again.

Teachers and senior leadership (which includes Ms Ash, our Inclusion AHT) meet to discuss all children within our termly 'Pupil Progress Meetings'.

We will let you know how your child has performed through our parents' evening session, and also through our 'Snapshot reports' which will be sent directly to you as parents on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> November.

Book bands will also change if appropriate, based on these assessments.

#### **Year 3 Topics**

Year 3 have had great fun this term learning about their new school. We drew maps of the school, wrote introductions using the 5 W's (ask your children) and learnt to use the library. Hopefully all your children are reading their banded book and changing it regularly. Please let your teacher know if you need any help with this.

We then started a unit on the Stone Age. We wrote an exciting adventure story inspired by the picture book Stone Age Boy. We were very impressed with the standard of writing across the year group. Please see an example above. We learnt about Stone Age life, including weapons, shelters and a chronological timeline. This culminated in our Chertsey Museum workshop were children were able to handle real artefacts from the period. In Science we have been learning all about rocks. How the three types of rock are formed and how they are part of an endless cycle that takes millions of years. The children especially enjoyed creating their own cave paintings using pastels.

In the next half-term we will be starting our 'We our Tourists' topic. This will look at comparing our own location of Surrey to the county of Cornwall. We will be taking a virtual tour of Mousehole in Cornwall and reading a story set in the village called The Mousehole Cat. The children will be writing a mystery story inspired by a picture book called 'The Secret of Black Rock'. We will be painting landscapes inspired by a local Cornish artist.

In Maths we will be continuing to learn how to add and subtract using column methods. We will then be moving onto methods of multiplication and division.

Please remember that Friday skills sessions are changing after half term. Oak will now be cooking or going to Forest school. Ash start swimming and Elm will be taking PE with Mr Coles.
