I know that the Year 5 children are looking forward to their residential trip next week. We have everything crossed that as many children as possible can attend, and that the teaching team stays well!

# **MRS RAHEEM**

Sadly, Mrs Raheem will be leaving us on 8th February. Mrs Raheem has worked at the school for several years and has supported children through our ELSA provision. I know that she will miss the school and the children very much. We are all very sad to see her leave us and wish her well for her future endeavours.

Mrs Cole is also trained in the ELSA programme, and she will continue the excellent work that Mrs Raheem has done with our children. We are also running nurture groups, play therapy and Lego therapy for children who need additional support with their mental and emotional wellbeing.

Horsell Junior School also operates a 'key adult' scheme. Children name an adult who they feel close to and this is the person in school who they should go to if they have any minor worries or concerns. In the majority of cases, a child's key adult is their class teacher, but it could be a teaching assistant, the SENCO or Mr Coles. If your child has any minor worries at school, please do remind them to discuss things with their key adult.

# **SAFEGUARDING TEAM**

Our safeguarding team meets every week to discuss the wellbeing of children in the school, and we now have some new members of the team.

Mr Coles monitors the children's online activity whilst at school and reports any concerns to the team. Mrs Cumberbeach is our mental health lead and is also responsible for our PSHE programme. Mrs Wiseman ensures that safeguarding records of new arrivals are up to date, and Mr Penstone is responsible for teaching the children about online safety as part of the computing curriculum.

If parents have any concerns about the welfare of a child, they should contact a member of the team.

### CHILDREN BEING COLLECTED BY OLDER SIBLINGS

If your child is being collected by an older sibling at High School, as a one off or regularly, please let their teacher or the office know so we can make a note on our system they have your permission. We also ask that siblings come onto school premises by themselves; friends should wait outside, away from the main school gates.

Children in year 3 and 4 who walk home with older siblings in year 5 and 6 need a walking home pass. The walking home pass will state they can only leave with their sibling.
