On Monday, Miss Chamberlin and I met with the local Inclusion Officer to review our school attendance. Attending school is extremely important and children who miss school are in danger of falling significantly behind with their learning. We understand that children can be ill which is why it is even more important that they are not removed from school for any other reasons, such as holidays. Pupils whose attendance falls below 95% are monitored and those who have low attendance are flagged to the inclusion service. Miss Chamberlin is responsible for this aspect of school life and she will be in touch if we have any concerns regarding your child's attendance. Thank you very much for your support with this.

Next week, we will be thinking about making positive friendship choices as part of our 'Reaching Out' Week.
