Florence Price (1887—1953)

This month, we are learning about American composer, **Florence Price**, whose music is inspired by combined classical music with the sound of spirituals and West African rhythms. In 1933, she became the first black female composter to have her work performed by a major orchestra.

This month we are listening to Florence Price's Symphony No. 1 in E minor, 3rd movement, which takes inspiration from the body percussion of the Juba Dance.

## **Swimming lessons**



As part of our enhanced curriculum, each class has a term of swimming lessons. During that term, they have a weekly lesson with a teacher from Julie's swim school.

The children are split into groups by ability, allowing each group to focus on increasing their confidence in water, learning to or improving their swimming skills as appropriate. They are taught front crawl, breaststroke or backstroke on a rotational basis, along with floating, push and glides. Each lesson ends with a couple of minutes free play.

Towards the end of the term, children will have one week where the children are taught about how to be safe in and around water.

The last lesson is usually a quick re-assessment followed by a game of water polo and other fun games. This is always a highlight for the children.

We would like to thank our swim teacher for her dedication to helping our children with this important life skill.
