It has been lovely to welcome parents into school for our Sports Days this week. The children all participated well and we are looking forward to our additional athletics competition on Friday afternoon.

Thank you to all of our parents who completed our parent questionnaires. It was lovely to read the positive comments and receive your feedback about the school. The results of the questionnaire will be reported to the governing body next week and forms part of our strategic planning for next year. Our school development plan, which is the document that sets our strategic plans for the next 12 months, will be posted on the website in September.

One area of concern for a small number of parents was our clubs. We have worked hard at providing a varied club offer, and we are lucky that Mr Coles is a member of permanent staff and can offer sports clubs after school. We know that some clubs are over-subscribed and have worked to make sign up easier. We supplement this with lots of clubs that are run by external providers, and, whilst there is a charge for this, parents who might be experiencing financial difficulty can approach the school in confidence for some financial assistance. As a junior school, we cannot offer the same number of clubs as a large primary, but we still have a wide selection, and we continually review this. Following from COVID, teachers now run academic boosters, to help those children who might need a little extra support – or a boost – with aspects of their learning.

NEW MEMBERS OF STAFF

Mr Stevenson will be starting school in September as our new Assistant Head for Inclusion, SEND and Safeguarding. He will be available to meet with parents in our weekly SEND surgeries – more details to follow in the new academic year.

Our ICT suite will be converted into an additional classroom (Apple) over the summer, and she will be working with smaller groups of children.
