It was lovely to welcome the open the book team back into school on Wednesday. They shared the story of the ten commandments with us and the children reflected on the importance of the rules that we live by at Horsell Junior School. At Horsell, we remember to be 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' at all times, and treat one another with dignity and respect.

Our new Apple classroom is now up and running and Mrs Smith is getting to know the children.

Across the school, our children are also enjoying using the new Chromebooks. We now have over 90 Chromebooks across the school, and a set of 30 IPADs, which is enabling us to teach computing more effectively and use ICT more creatively across the curriculum.

There is now a new RE agreed syllabus across Surrey and we have started to teach it this term. Our Year 4 children have been enjoying learning about Humanism, the children in Year 5 are studying Islam, Year 6 are investigating

Hinduism and Year 3 are learning about Jesus and how He changed lives. The new syllabus enables the children to learn all about the major world faiths and, at the end of each academic year, finishes with a 'thematic unit' where they answer questions like, 'Why do people use creative ways to express their beliefs?' Our teachers engaged in lots of RE training before the summer break and are enjoying teaching the new content.

We are looking forward to clubs starting next week.
