Climate Justice is all about fighting for the people who have done the least to cause the climate crisis, but who are the most affected by it. Meanwhile the people who have done the most to emit greenhouse gases into the atmosphere, the people in the wealthy countries like ourselves, are those who are so far affected the least by climate change. Each class planned and designed their own collaborative piece of artwork to show what Climate Justice meant to them. It was an important time for us to reflect on our hopes for the future and to recognise how we can better look after God's world. We know that we can have hope to make a difference together.
