Did you know that you have a dedicated School Nursing team?

A member of the Woking School Nursing Team is available every Wednesday between 9.30am and 11.30am (including holidays) at the Child Health Drop-In at Eastwood Leisure Centre, Albert Drive, Sheerwater, Woking GU21 5RF.

They are available to answer questions from parents/carers of school aged children and to give advice, information and signpost on topics including early toileting, sleep, behaviour, healthy diet, dental care, school readiness, NCMP heights & weights, mental health, eating disorders, minor illnesses, internet safety and much more. They can also help with referrals to other services.

Climate Justice Exhibition











As part of our Global Neighbours project, the school have been 'Getting Creative for Climate Justice'. Climate Justice is all about fighting for the people who have done the least to cause the climate crisis, but who are the most affected by it.

Each class designed their own collaborative piece of artwork to show what Climate Justice meant to them. Some classes contrasted our future planet with and without climate action, Cherry class focussed on time running out to take action, and Willow designed bank notes representing the countries who are responsible for the most pollution. Oak used outlines of their hands with messages to show how we can all give a hand and a clenched fist to show we are all fighting this together.
