
Ernest Shackleton was a Victorian explorer. He wanted to be the first person to reach the South Pole and had three unsuccessful expeditions.

LATITUDE AND LONGITUDE:



Antarctica is located at the southernmost point on the globe. It experiences extreme blizzards and snowstorms, has many mountain ranges and even an active volcano.

This is a map of Antarctica shown from above the South Pole.

This is where to find Antarctica on a globe. It is below the Antarctic Circle.

KEY VOCABULARY



ANTARTIC CIRCLE: the most southerly of the five major circles of latitude that mark maps of Earth.



CLIMATE: The long term weather patterns of a region.



LATITUDE: Invisible horizontal lines mapped on our globe to show how far north or south a place is from the Equator.



LONGITUDE: Invisible vertical lines mapped on our globe to show how far east or west a place is.



ICE SHEET (GLACIER): A layer of ice covering the land for a long period of time, also known as a glacier.




ICEBERG: Large chunks of floating ice that break off a glacier.
