FFT National
Attendance Award
2023/24

Horsell Junior School have recently received the National School Attendance Award for being in the top 10% of FTT (Fischer Family Trust) Primary Schools in England.

You may have seen in the news recently that the Department for Education has updated its guidance on school attendance which follows on from the government led campaign, "Moments Matter, Attendance Counts". These initiatives are based on widespread research that show being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development and that students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all that you do to ensure your child attends school regularly. Of course, we are aware that some children face greater barriers to attendance, such as long term medical conditions, special educational needs and disabilities. We encourage you to keep working with us to try to remove these barriers as best we can so that we can give your child the best possible experience at school. 

INTER-HOUSE MATHS COMPETITION

The Upper School Inter-House Maths Competition was a thrilling event comprising three rounds that tested students' mathematical mastery and teamwork skills.

In the initial round, students tackled individual maths questions, demonstrating their problem-solving abilities on whiteboards. The initial standings saw Hatchlands in fourth place with 63 points, Clandon in third with 76 points, Loseley in second with 80 points, and Polesdon leading with 84.

The competition intensified in the second round as students engaged in head-to-head times tables challenges within their classes. Polesdon House maintained their lead with 94 points, while Loseley and Clandon closely followed with 83 and 80 points respectively. Hatchlands showed improvement with 66 points.

The final round tested the students' collaborative problem-solving skills with a focus on a perimeter-related challenge. The competition reached its climax as the students worked together, demonstrating resilience and strategic thinking. Ultimately, Clandon emerged victorious with a total score of 129 points, followed by Polesdon with 120 points. Hatchlands secured third place with 112 points, while Loseley finished fourth with 95 points.

The competition not only highlighted the students' mathematical abilities but also emphasised the importance of teamwork and perseverance in overcoming challenges.
