

MAKING PAPYRUS STYLE PAPER:









Papyrus is a riverside plant used to make paper.

The Ancient Egyptians would paint their artwork onto papyrus.

KEY VOCABULARY



ANCIENT: Something from a long time ago.



COMPOSITION: Putting different elements together.



EGYPTIAN: Someone or something from Egypt.



LAYOUT: The arrangement of different elements on a given space.



PATTERN: A design in which shapes, colours and lines are repeated.




TECHNIQUE: Skills used by an artist to produce a piece of art.



IMAGERY: A collection of images from a range of art forms.

ANCIENT EGYPTIAN SCROLLS:



Ancient Egyptian paintings are painted in 2D (flat images) and not in 3D.

They used white, black, red, yellow, green and blue. These colours came from minerals they would find around the area they lived in.

The most important people were often the largest object in Ancient Egyptian paintings.

People were always painted from the side.
