
Video Editing

- Video is a visual media format.

-There are many different pieces of hardware that can create videos including: smartphones, Ipads and video recording cameras. All these devices will record audio too,

-We can use different camera angles to capture our subjects in different ways. A quality video will be edited. This will involve using software to cut clips to appropriate lengths and put them in the correct order

Script: Hi my name is _____ and I've been learning about filming techniques. This is a close up shot.	Script: This is a long shot. It means you can see the background, but the audio is not as good because I'm not near the microphone.	Script: This is a zoom. The camera stays in the same place, but the zoom on the camera makes me appear larger.

A storyboard is a way to plan what you will film. In this unit you will need to plan the different types of angle you want to film at and in which order. A storyboard will also explain what dialogue you will want to use in your film. This will need to be picked up by your microphone, Make sure to film in a quiet environment so as not pick up any background noise.

KEY VOCABULARY:



Video: A visual product involving music images



Angle: In filming, this is the angle that the camera takes to the subjects.



Audio: The broadcasting of sound.



Zoom: When the camera gets close to it's subject.



Close up: A camera angle where the subject is close to the camera.



Storyboard: A plan of all the camera shots and dialogue in a video before it is made.




Panning: When a camera moves to follow it's subject



Editing: In film, this is when clips are shortened and put in order.

Camera Angles



1. Close up

2. Mid range

3. Long shot

4. Moving subject

5. Side by side

6. High, low, or normal
