Edward recently passed his Grade 1 piano exam with merit. Congratulations!

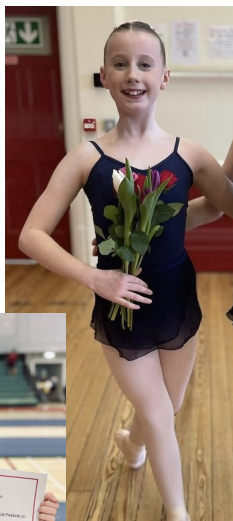


### Eliza and Alice (Acer)

# Baked with love!

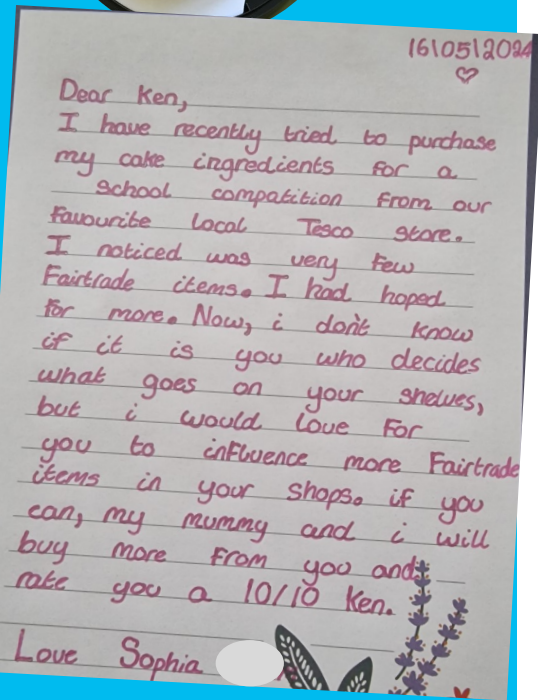
