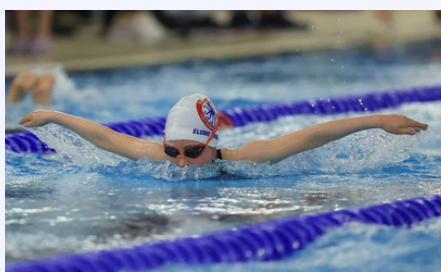
HOUSE POINTS
